

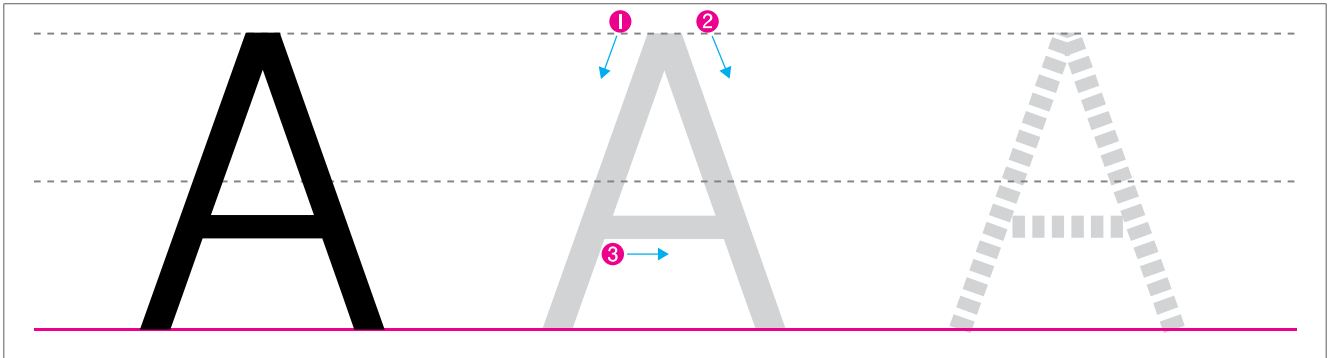


Trace the Letter A

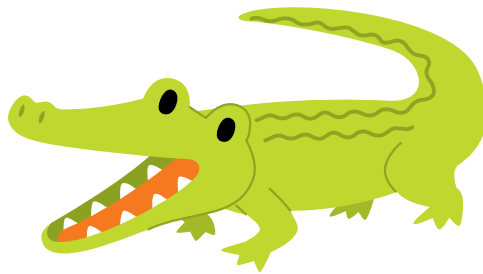

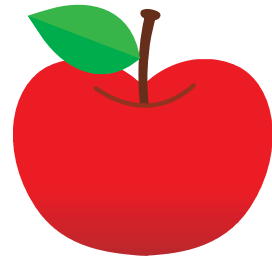
Trace the A and say "A."

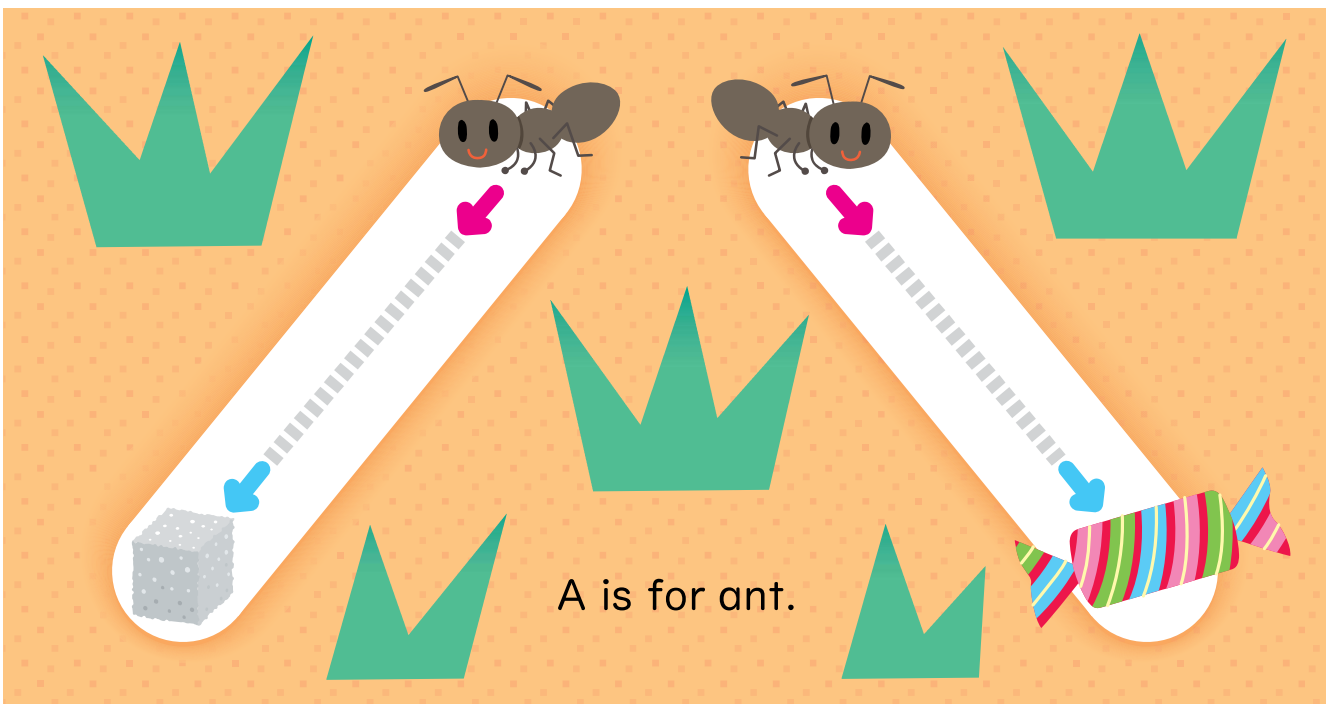

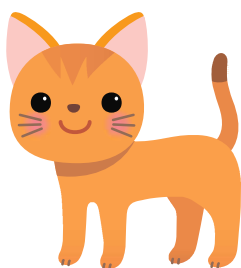
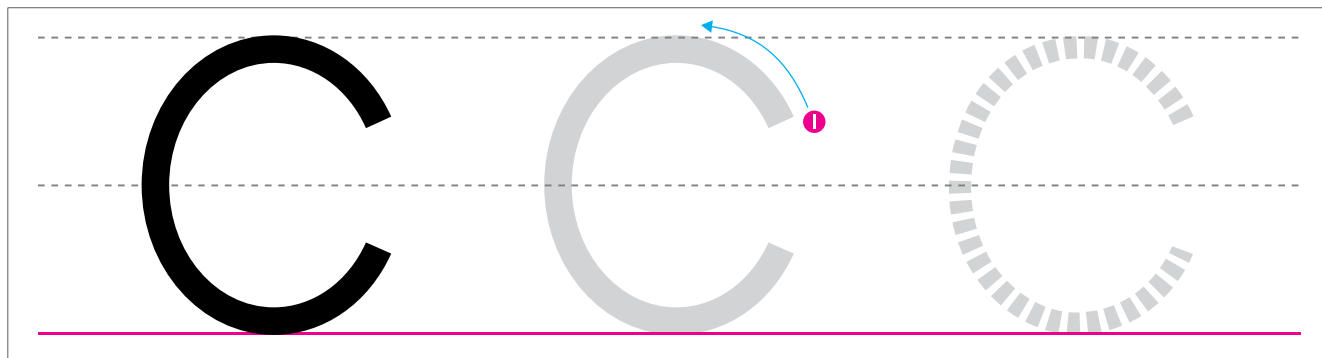


Trace the Letter C

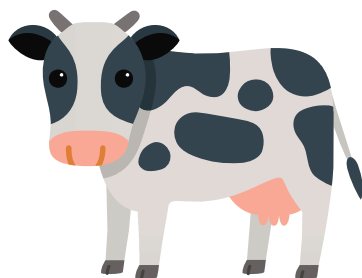

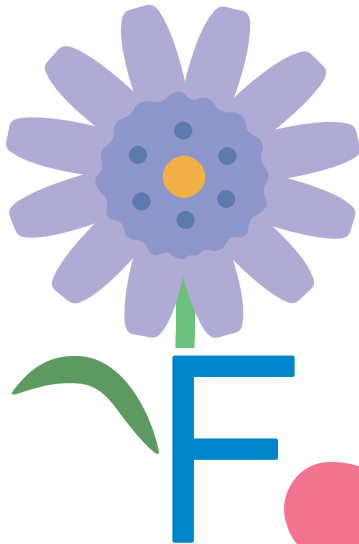
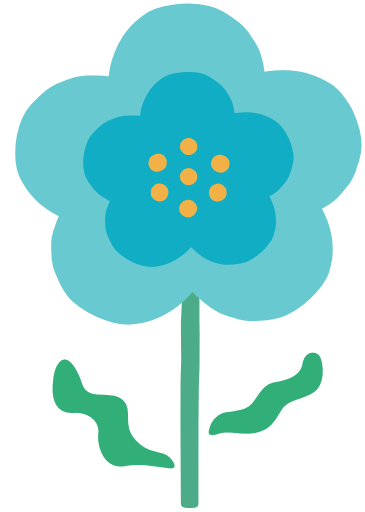
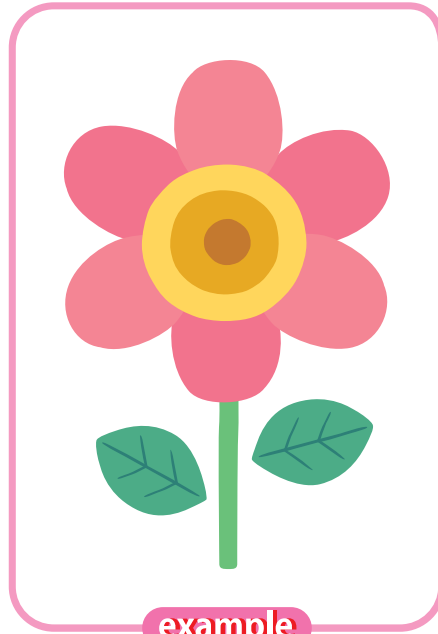
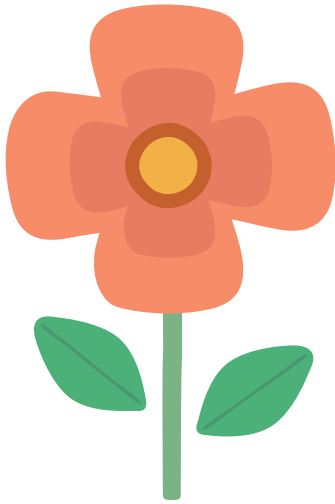
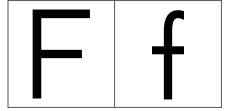


Find the Letter F

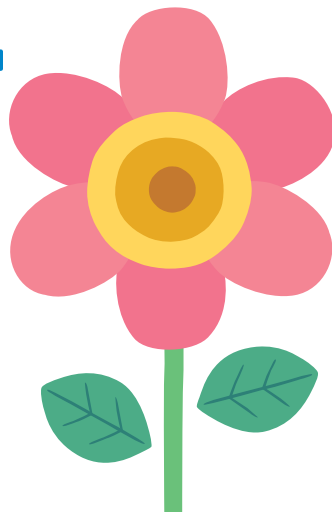
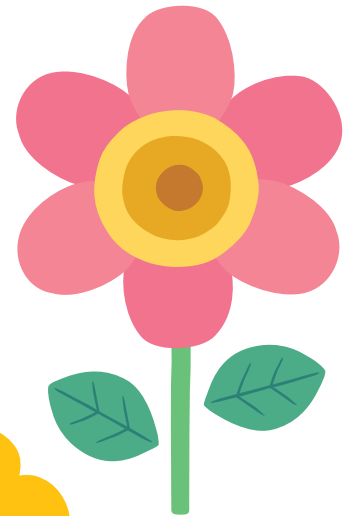
To Parents: This activity focuses on observation skills to differentiate between various shapes and colors. Point out the example flower. Help your child begin to recognize the details that make things similar and different.

F is for flower.

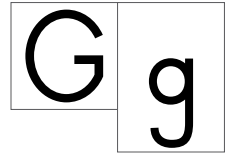


Find the Letter G
