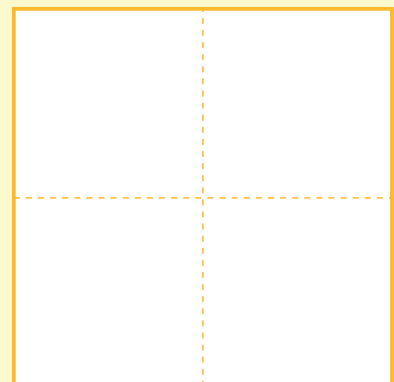
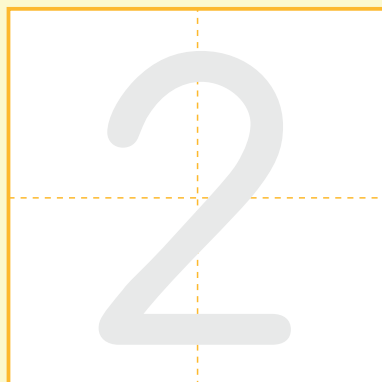
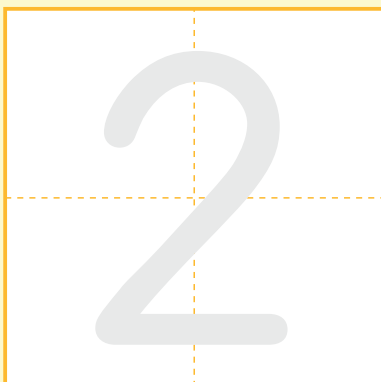
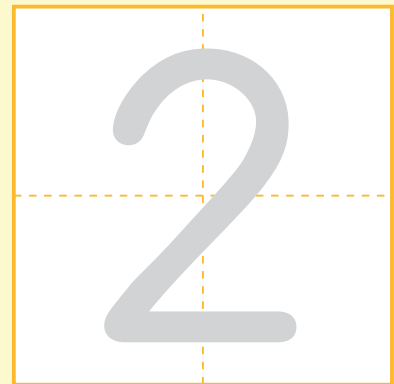
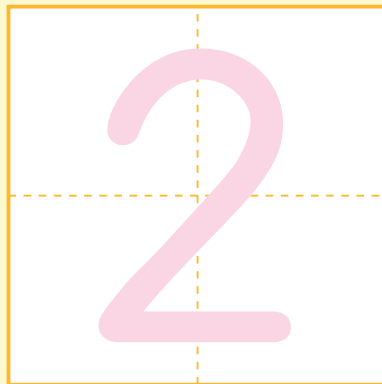
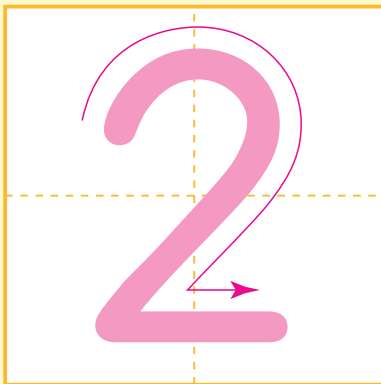


Let's Write the Number 2

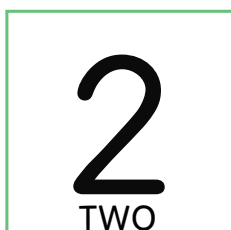
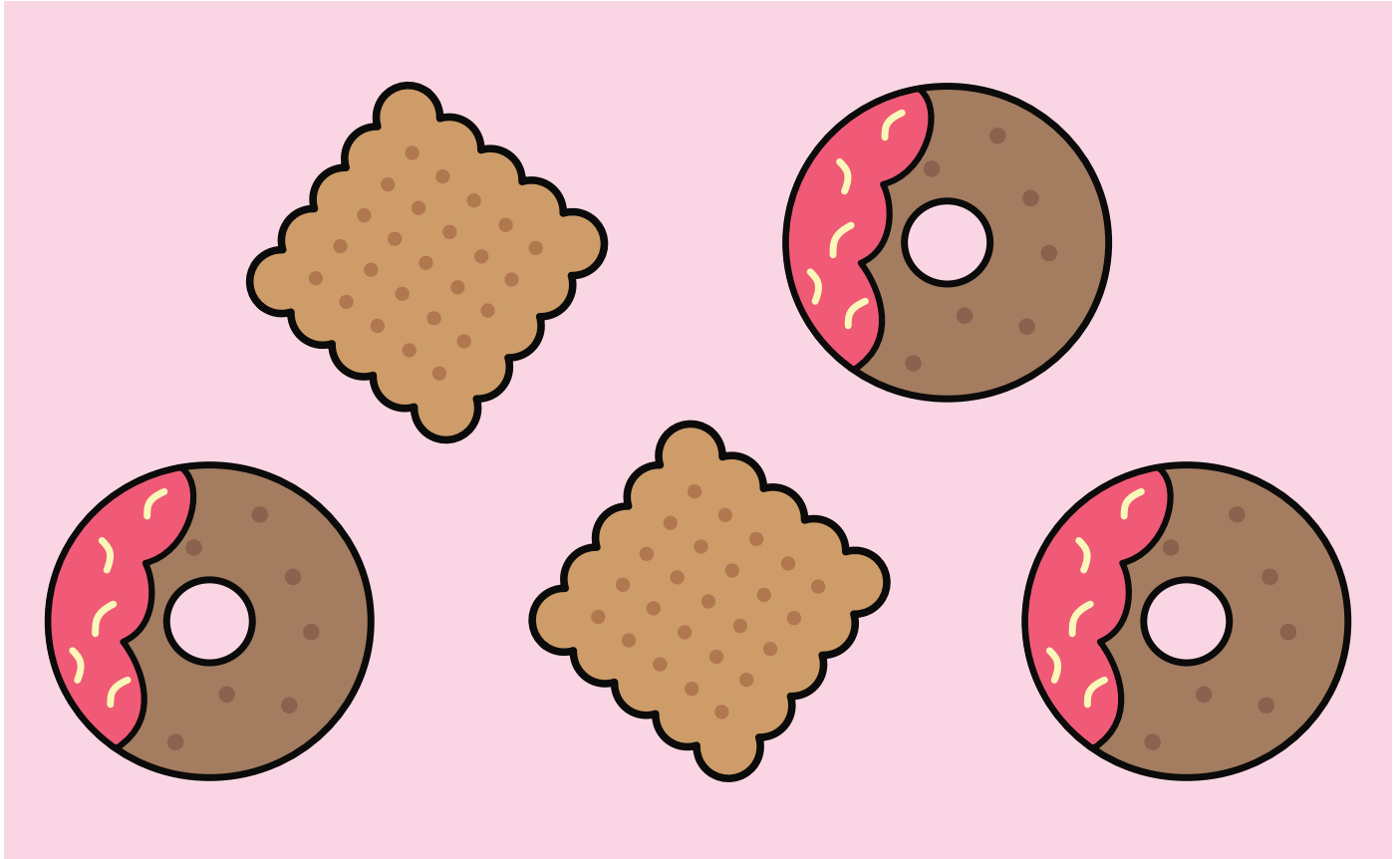


Let's Match the Number

Count the donuts. Then, draw a line from ● to ● to connect the picture to the number that matches the quantity.

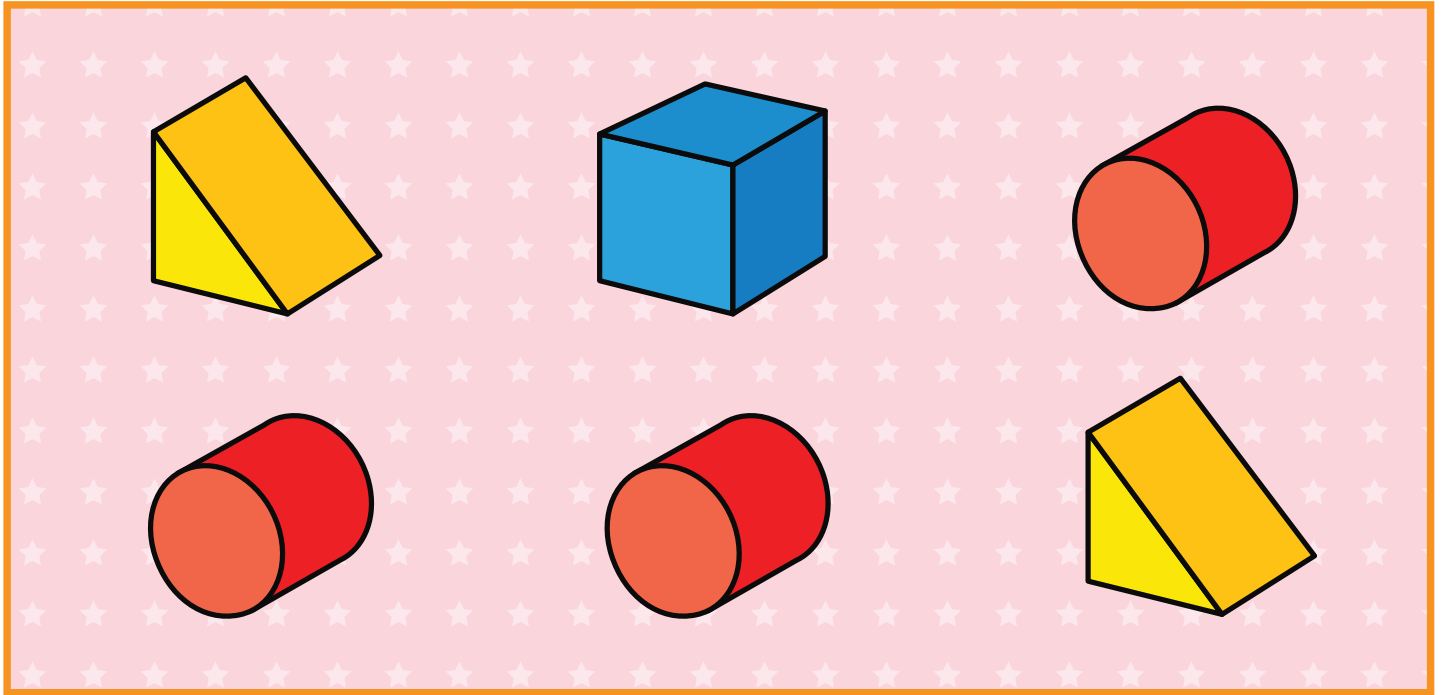


To Parents: On this page, your child will practice sorting and counting different types of similar objects.



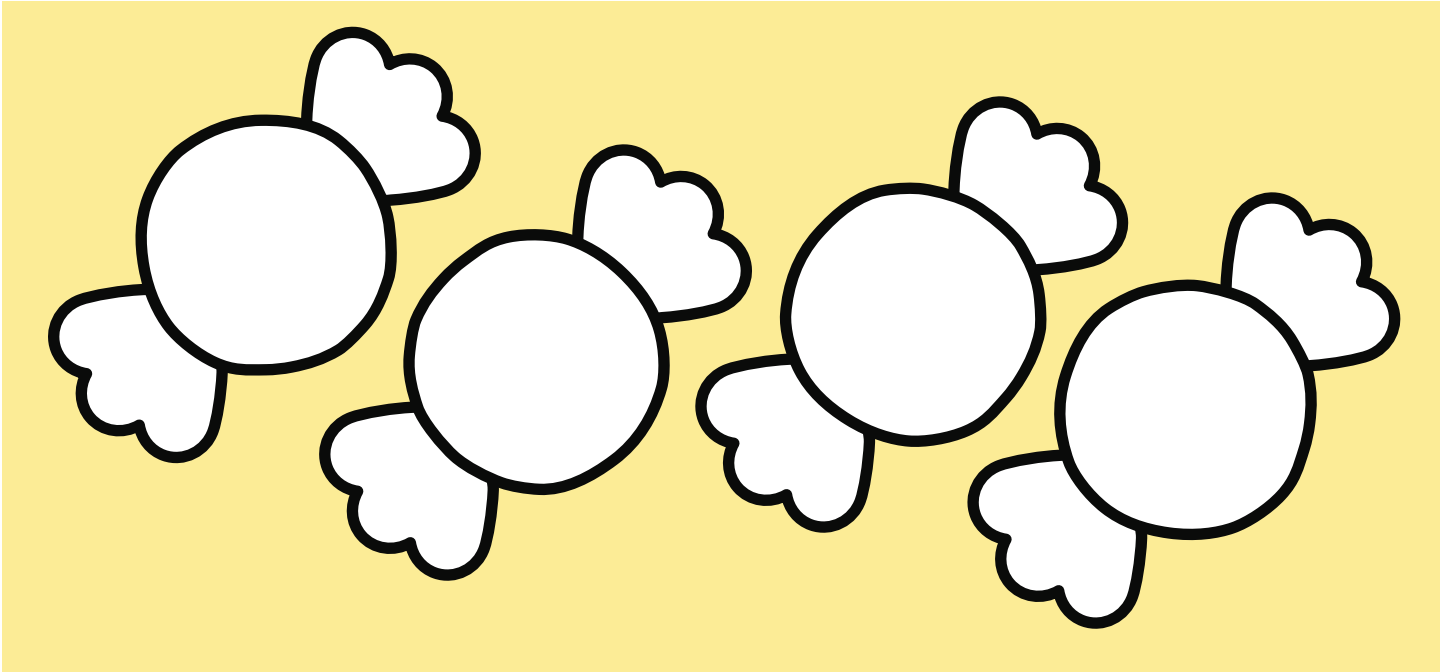

Let's Color and Trace



To Parents: Here, your child will gain an understanding of how to connect a number with the quantity it represents. Encourage your child to pay attention to the arrows when tracing the number.
